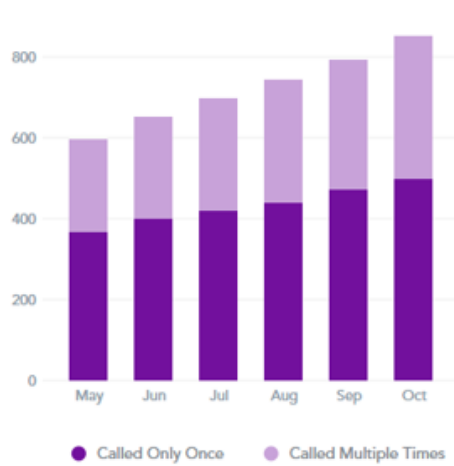

- 18 Midwifery Practices

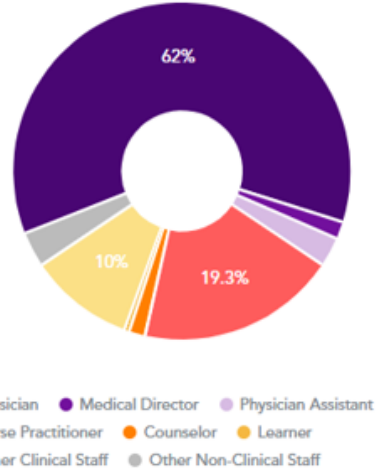


PeriPAN: Consultation Volume & Enrollment (as of October 31, 2024)

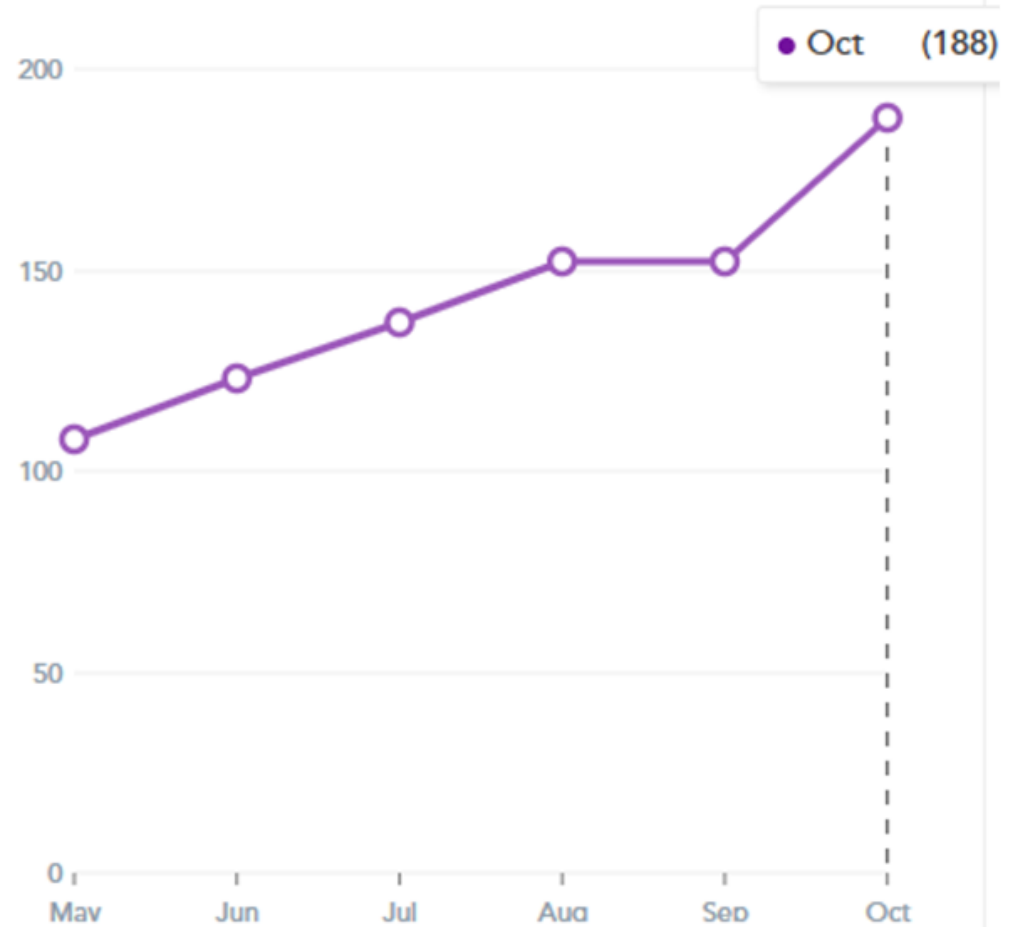
Clinic Staff Engagement

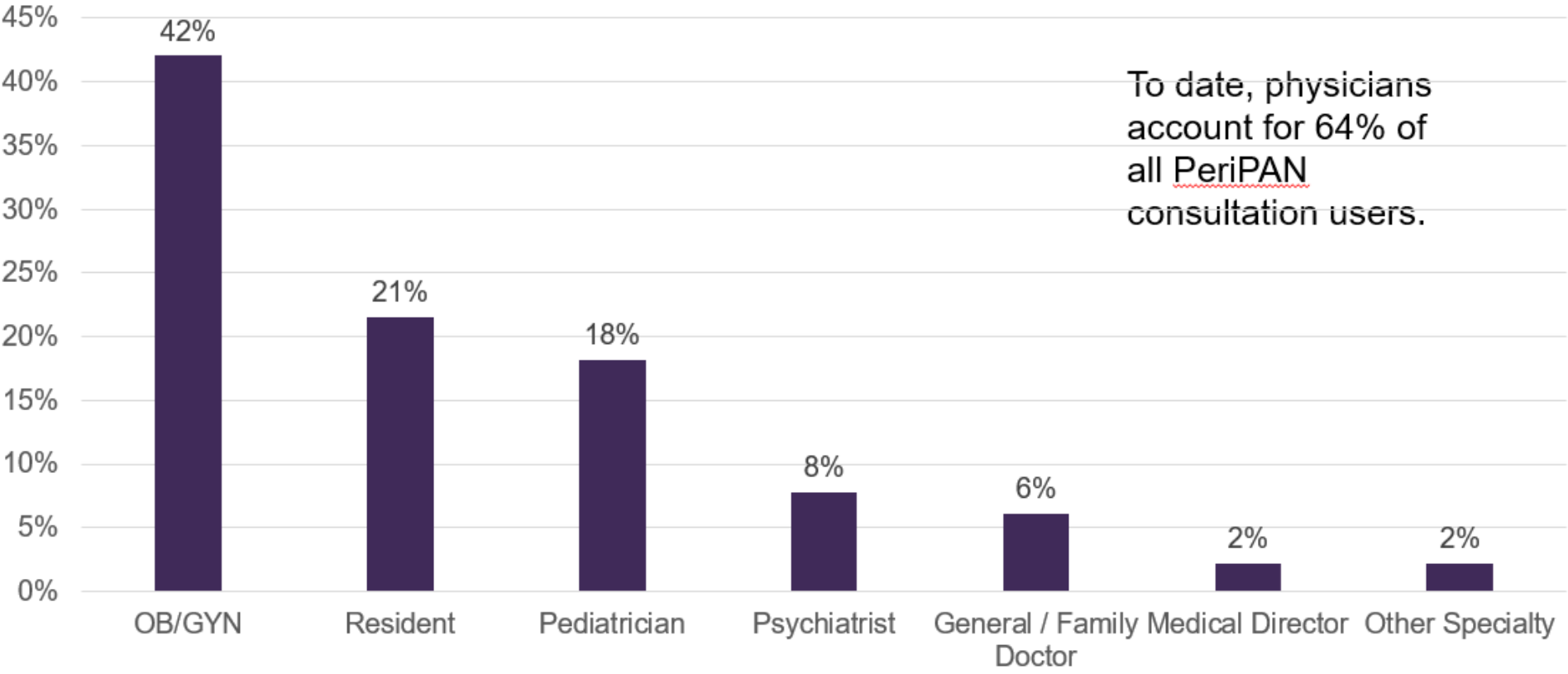

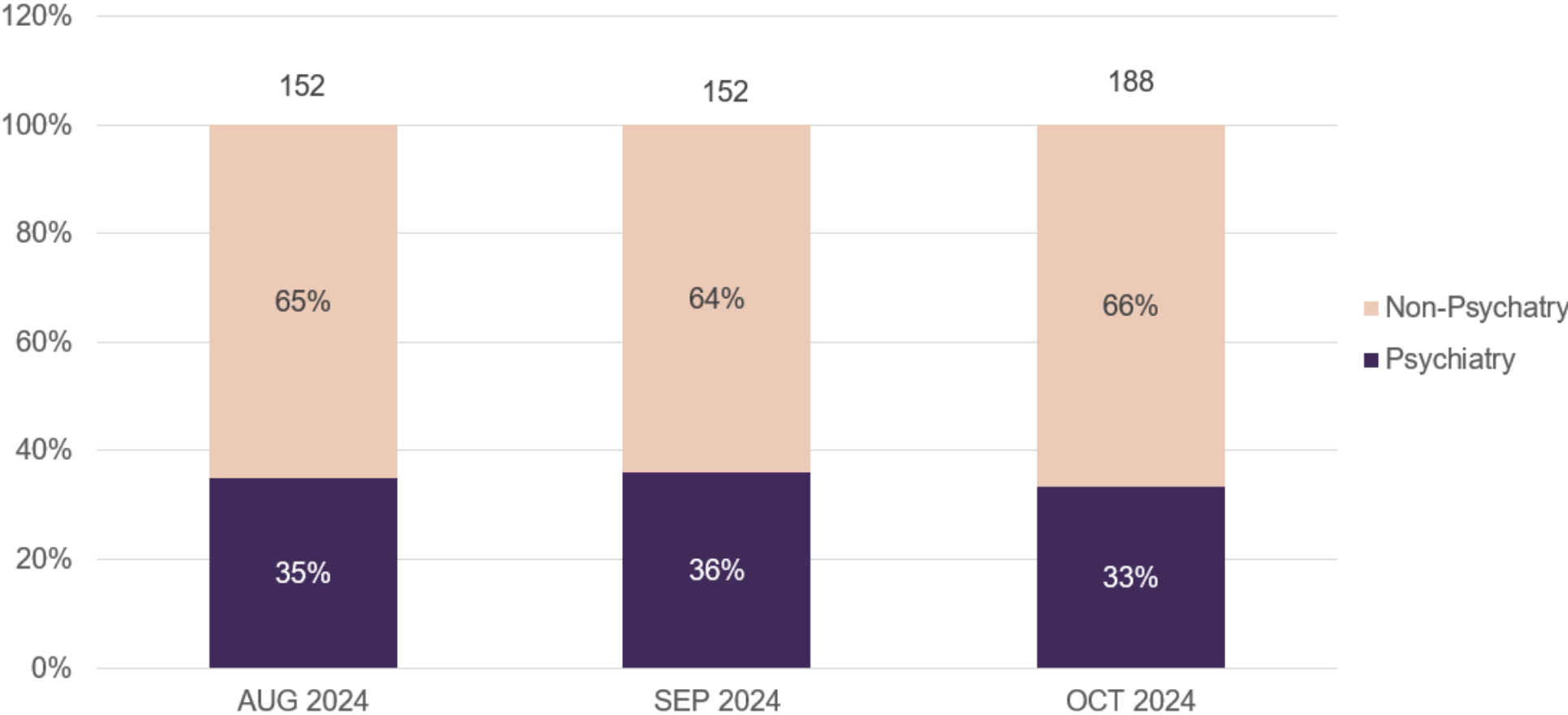

as of October 31, 2024

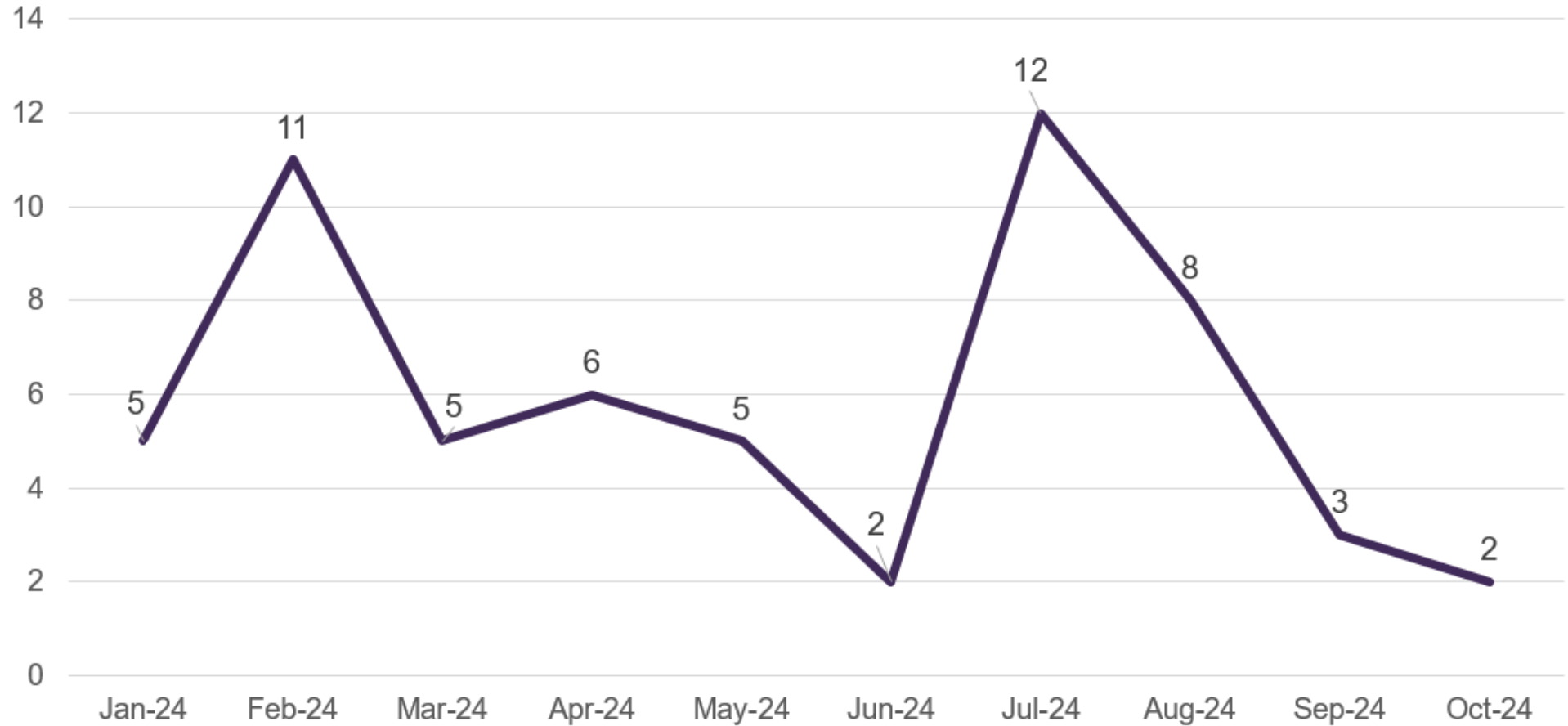


PeriPAN Consultations by Type (Psychiatry & Non-Psychiatry), August – October 2024
