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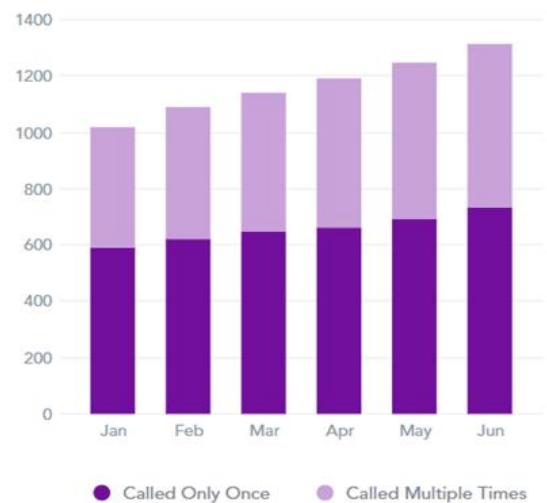

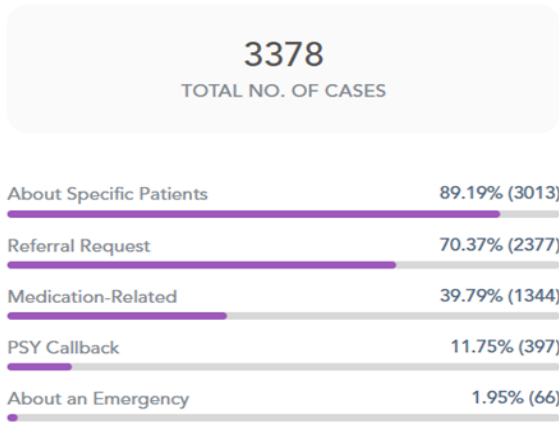

PeriPAN: Consultation Volume & Enrollment (as of June 30, 2025)

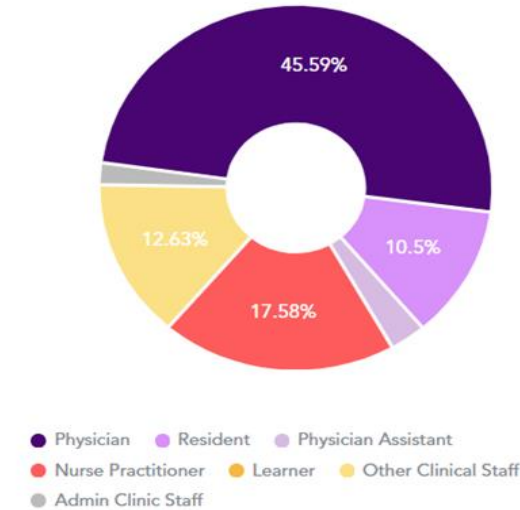

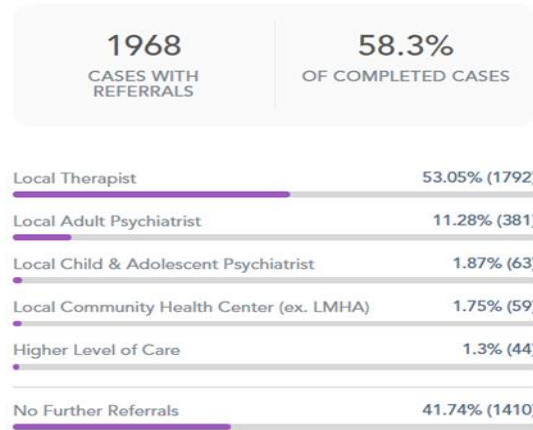
Purpose of Contact *i*



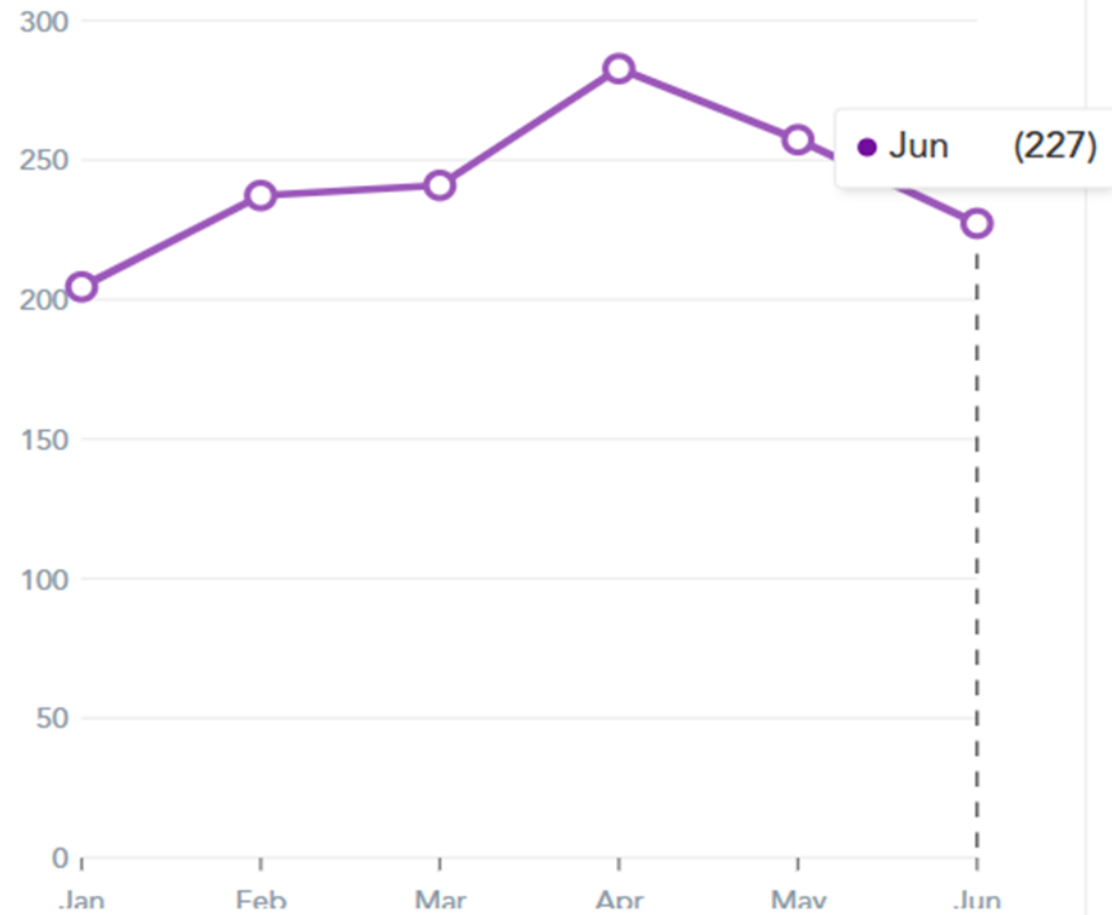
Clinic Staff Roles *i*

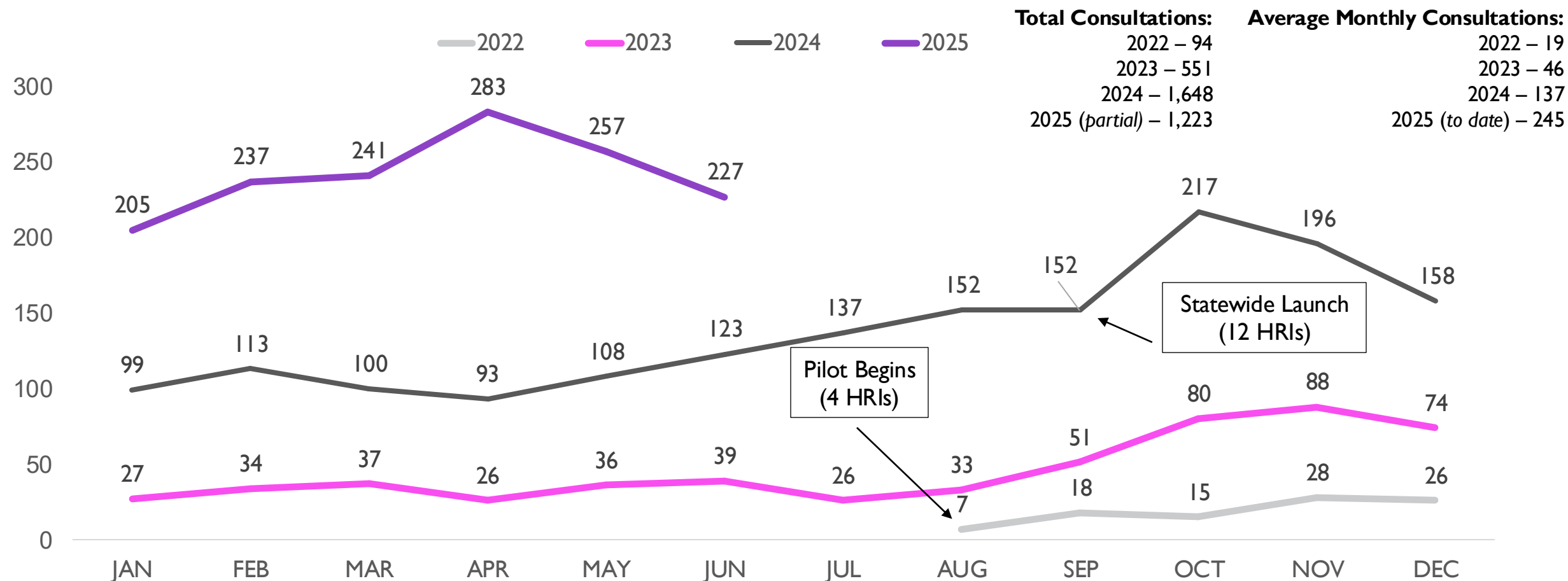


Monthly Consult Volume *i*

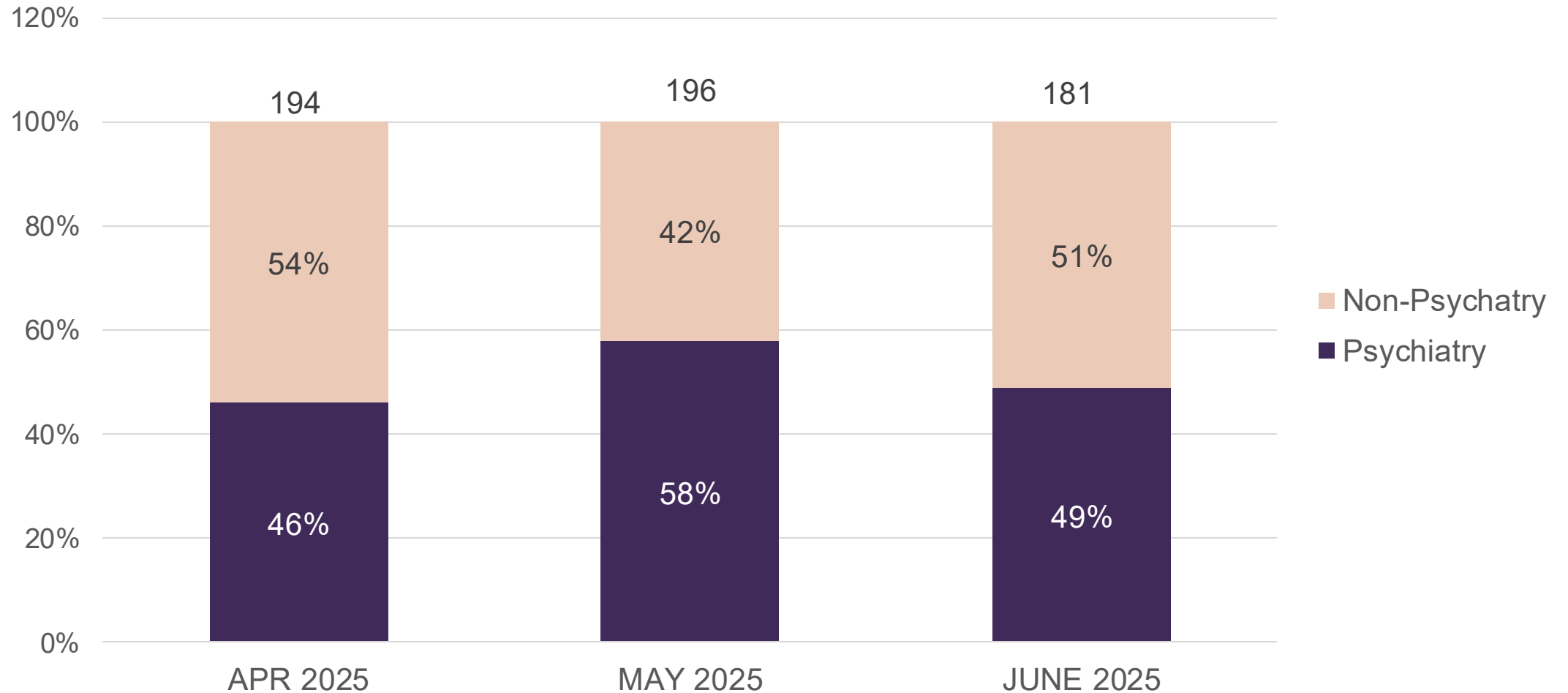


PeriPAN: Total Consultations by Month & Calendar Year

as of June 30, 2025

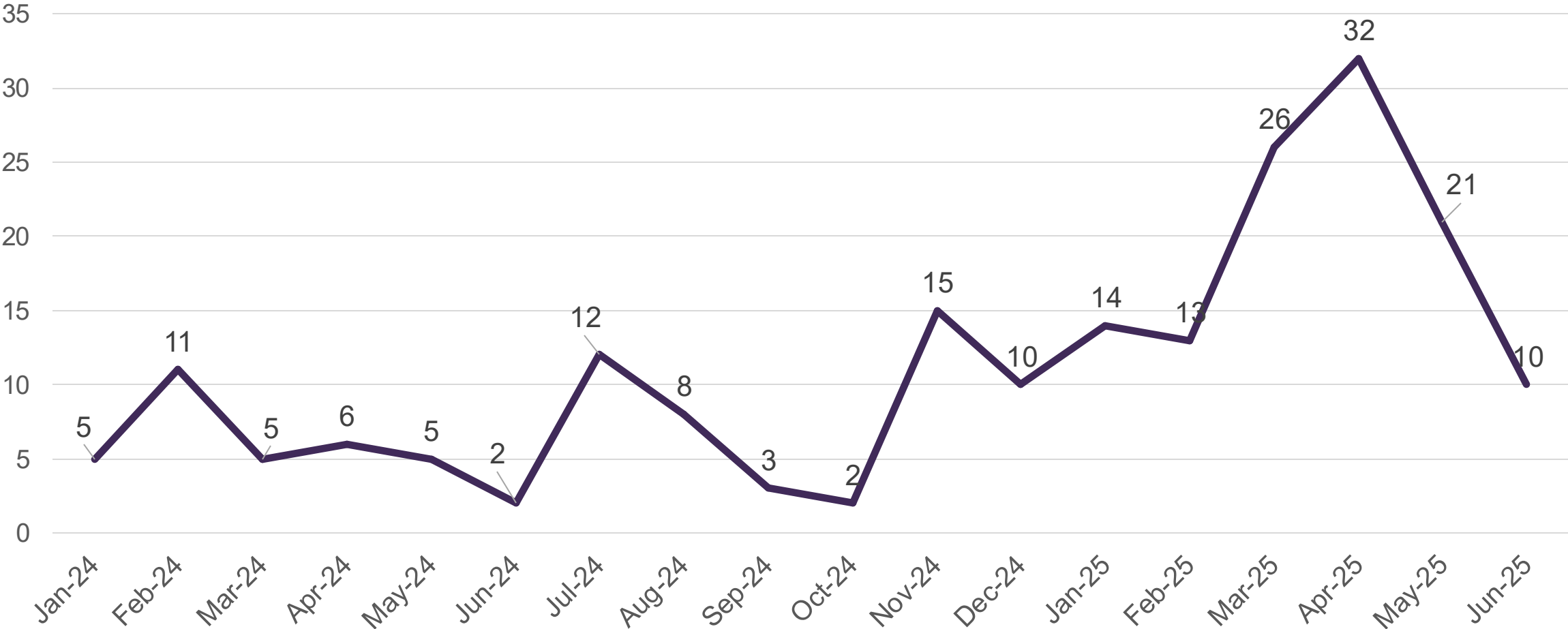


PeriPAN Consultations by Type (Psychiatry & Non-Psychiatry), April 2025 – June 2025

as of June 30, 2025

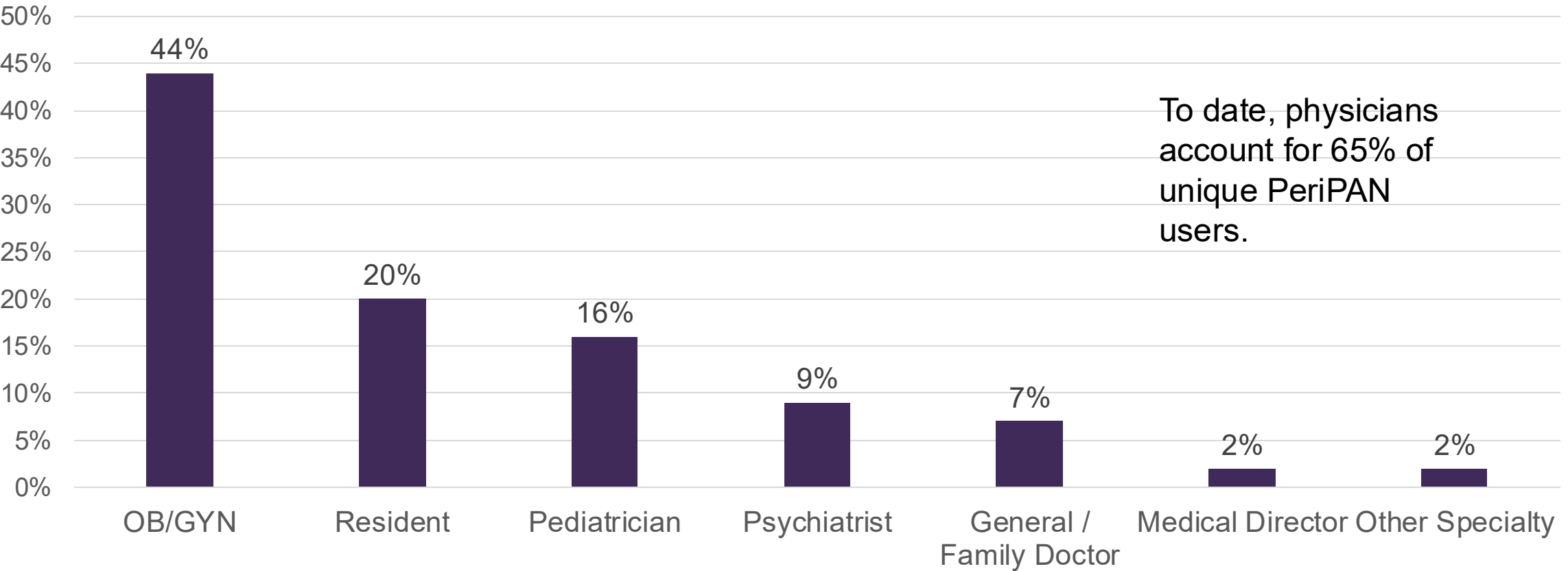

- Lantana user workgroup- reviewing workflow and possible improvement opportunities

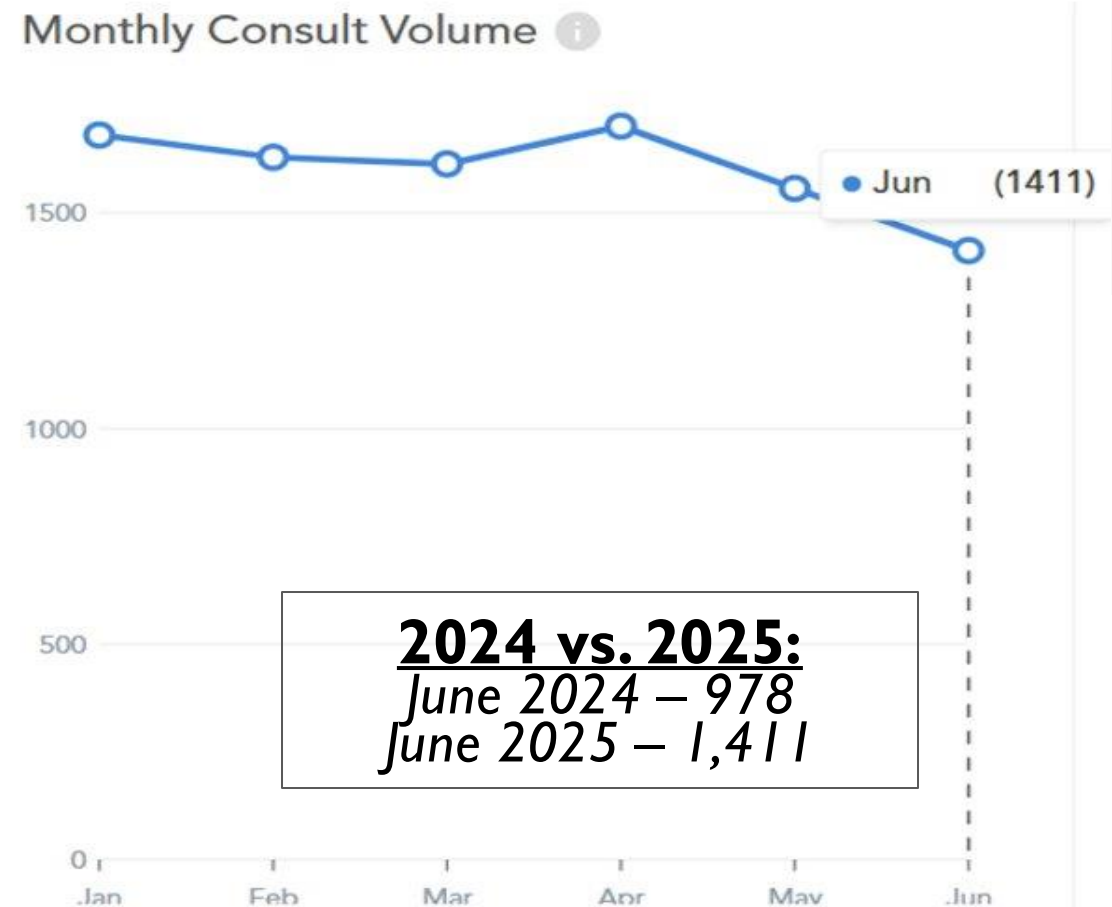


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CPAN Consultation Volume & Enrollment

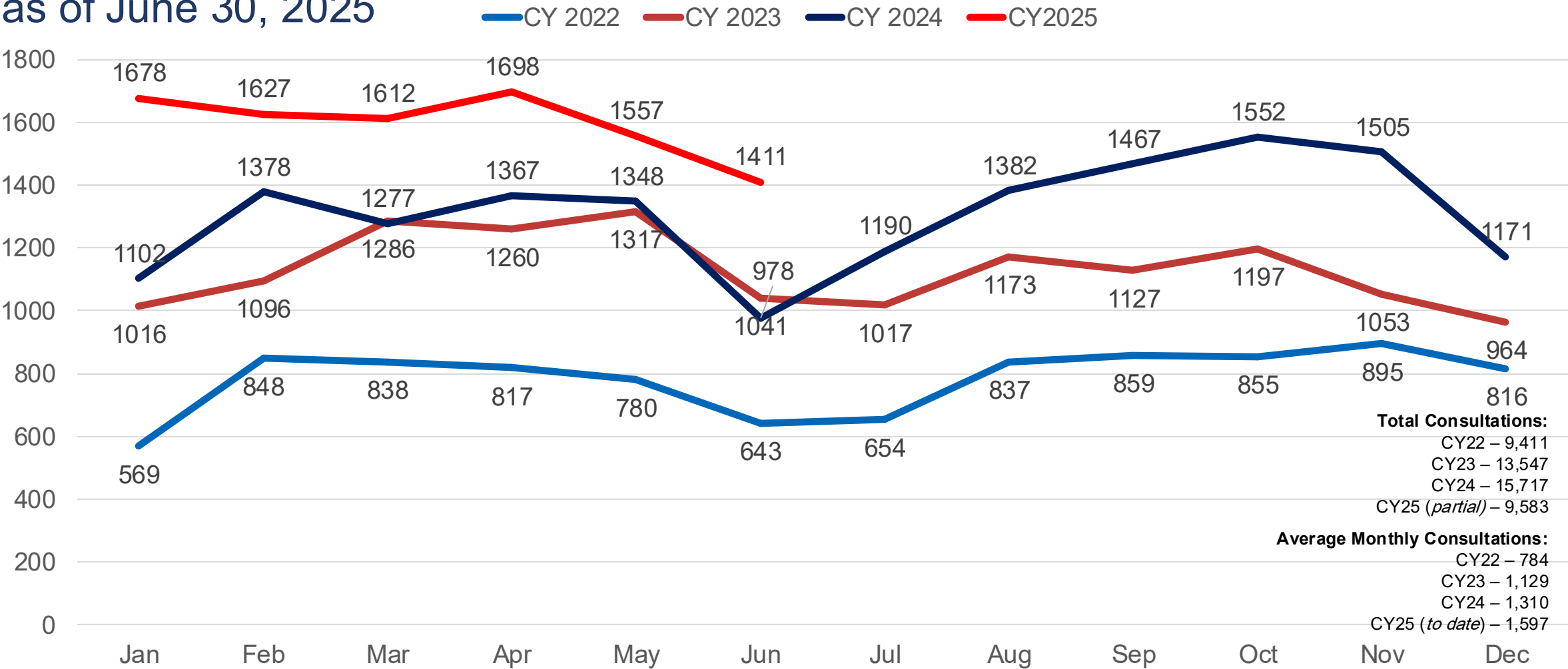


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CPAN Consultations by Month and Year

as of June 30, 2025



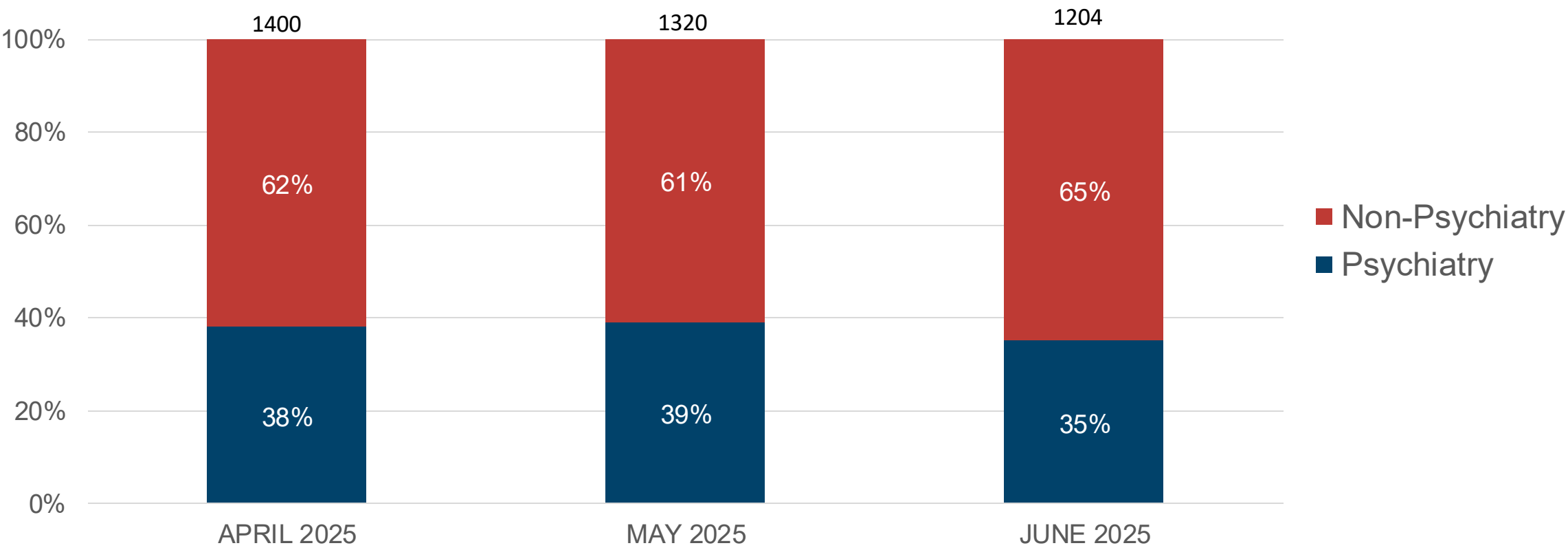
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CPAN Consultations by Type (Psychiatry & Non-Psychiatry), April 2025 – June 2025

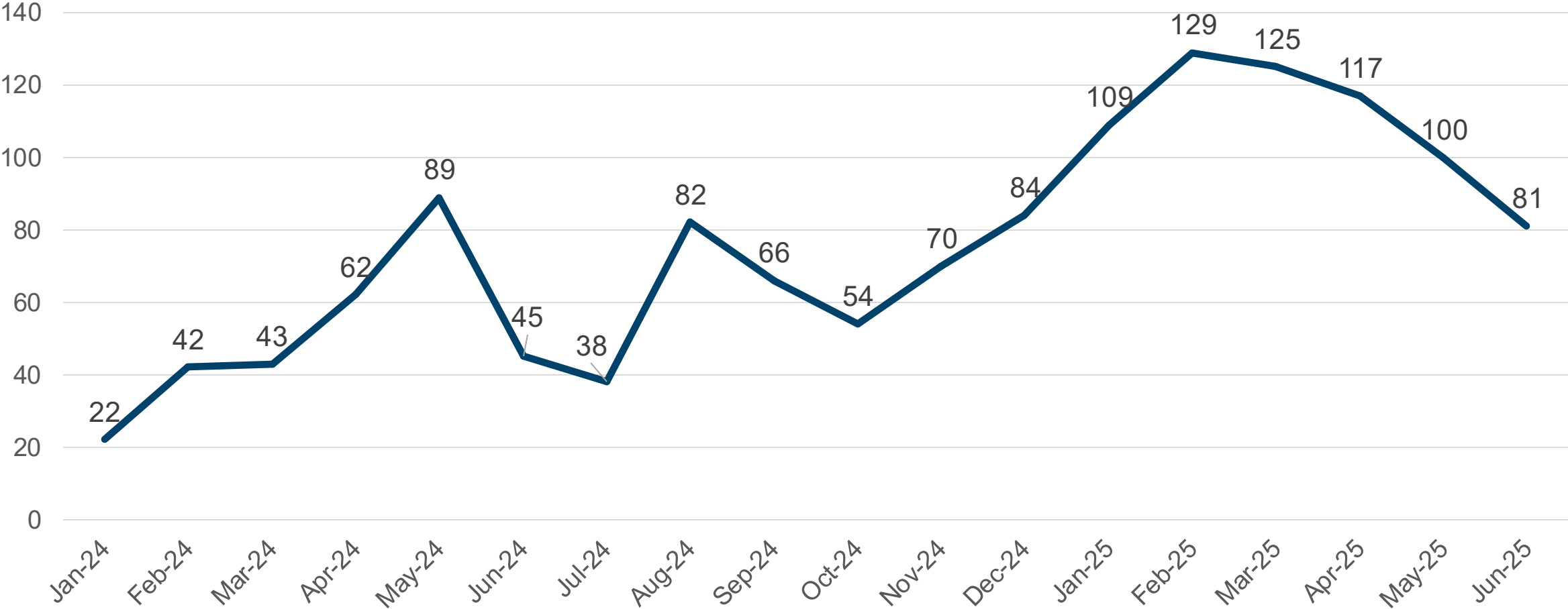


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CPAN Direct Patient Consultations by Month

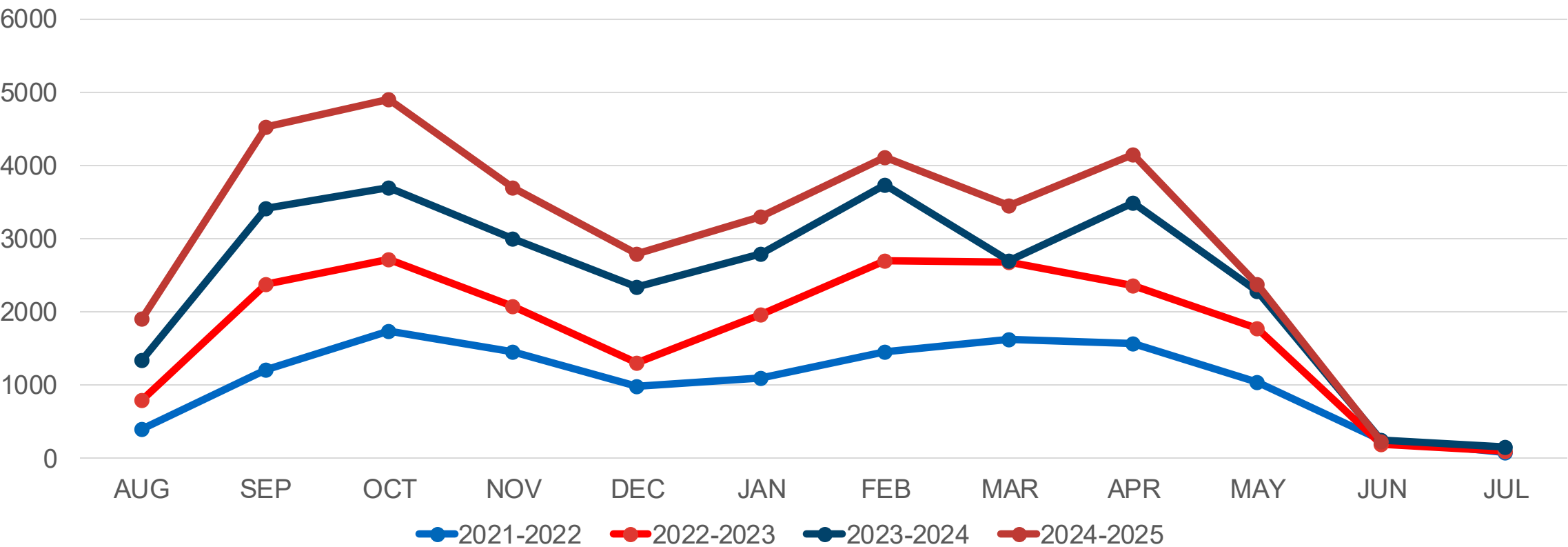
Projects in Process

- Intermediate Services– Work group recommendations being finalized for review by UTS and TCHATT Leadership
- Working with teams to prepare for upcoming school year. Participating in back-to-school events and providing support and resources for statewide engagement.
- Trayt – Updating and revising training materials for HRIs. Working with HRIs, IE, UTS to improve workflow and maintain data collection integrity, as well as integrate changes needed for new data and program needs.

as of June 30, 2025



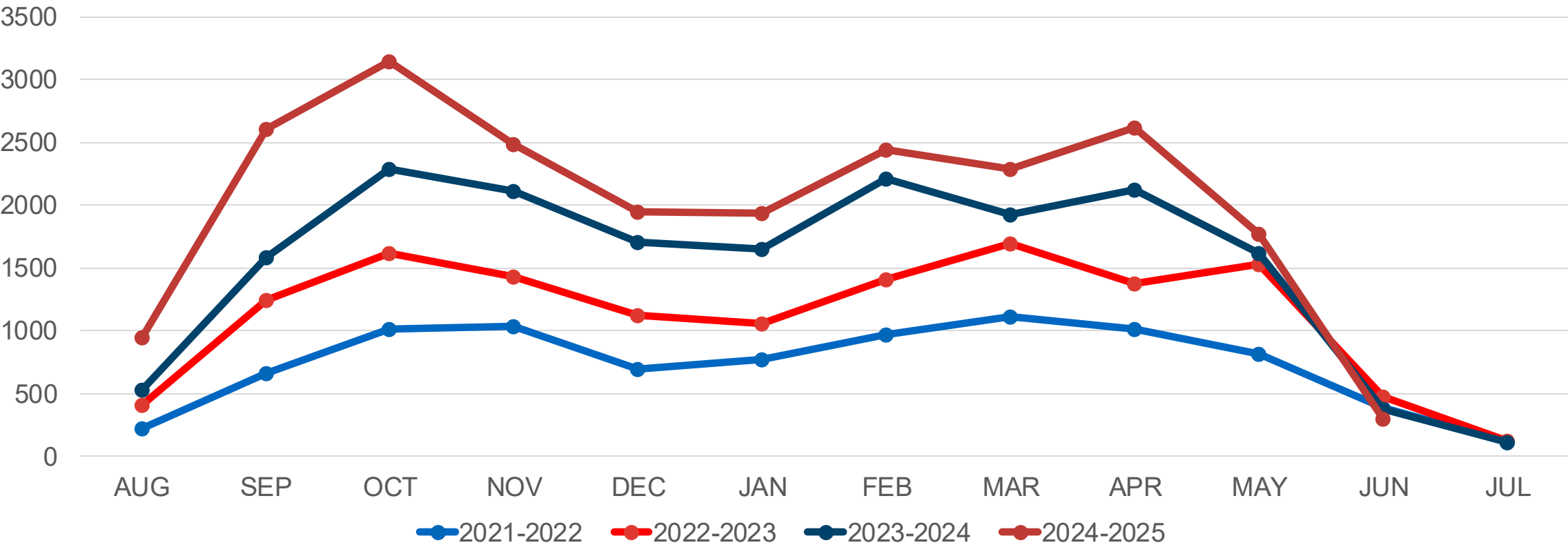

as of June 30, 2025

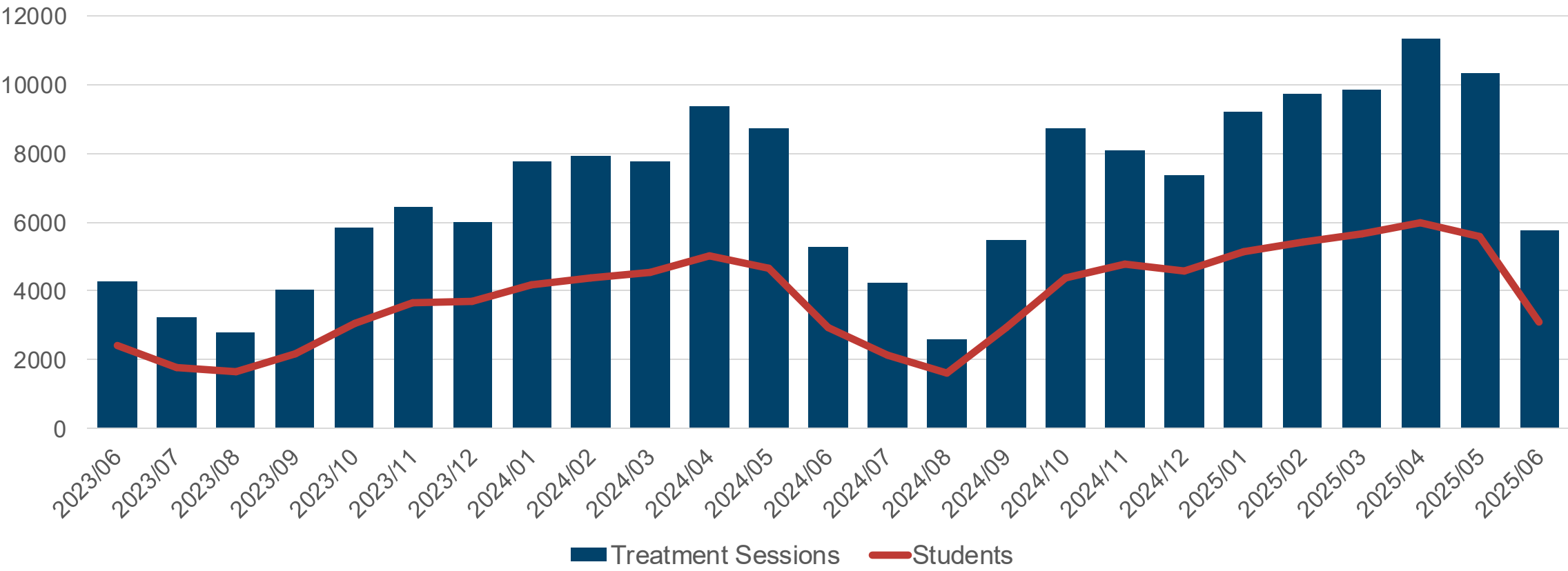


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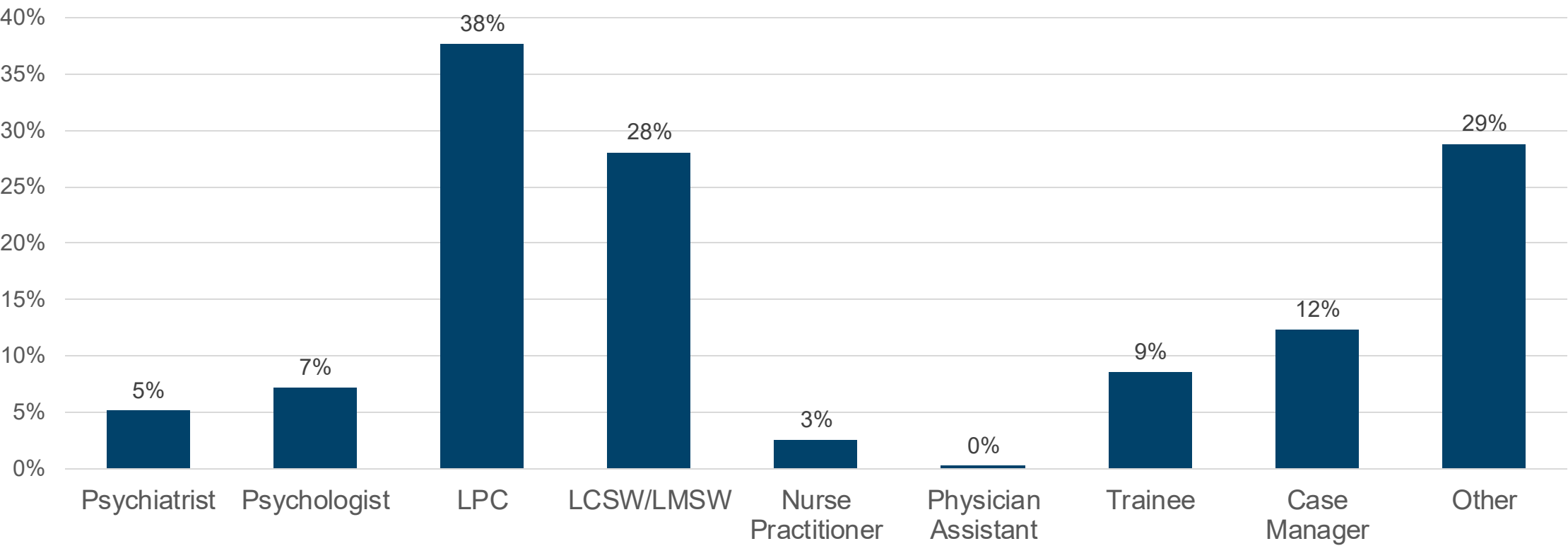
Number of Treatment Sessions and Clients Served by Month
