

What is Activ8?

- 8-week telehealth program for teens and their caregiver
- Focused on improving teen depression
- Led by trained interventionist

Who can participate?


- ✓ Ages 12-18
- ✓ Enrolled in TX-YDSRN
- ✓ Willing participation from caregiver and teen

How does behavioral activation work?

A skill-building approach to break the cycle of depression. Based on research and focused on setting goals to increase behaviors that match with personal values.



NIH. Social media Concerns Related to Emotional Experiences in Naturalistic Settings: SCREENS.

SCREENS will investigate how social media use amount and positive/negative experiences impact internalizing symptom trajectories over 6 months and determine whether in-person social context factors impact the relationship between social media and internalizing symptoms.

- Participants will be recruited from the TX-YDSRN Registry Study.
- This study will be led by MPIs Drs. Trivedi and Goodman with Co-Is Drs. Kennard and Minhajuddin.

SCREENS will advance understanding of the relationships between social media use and internalizing symptoms in depressed and/or suicidal youth.
