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Definition of Measure Types



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Performance Measures

Performance measures are intended to help each HRI regularly assess its own performance and use quality improvement methods to reach its targets. These targets are customized for each HRI based on its historical performance. The goal is to drive improvement at the state level by setting realistic, attainable targets and supporting ongoing quality improvement efforts within each HRI. Performance results and targets are visible only to the individual HRI and are not shared publicly or with other HRIs.

Observational Measures

Observational measures are intended to provide HRIs with relevant data to monitor activities and progress in the program, including showing how their data compares to statewide results. Each HRI can see its own data along with the quartile in which it falls relative to others. These measures are informational only. They do not include targets. Like performance measures, results are visible only to the individual HRI and are not shared publicly or with other HRIs.

CPWE: Proposed Performance Metrics

- **Educational Experience of Resident** The cumulative (by fiscal year) proportion of residents reflecting that the rotation provided them with an excellent educational opportunity, defined by responses of “agree” or “strongly agree” on this item on the rotation survey.
- **Increased Understanding of Community Psychiatry** The cumulative (by fiscal year) proportion of residents reflecting that the rotation increased their understanding of community psychiatry. This will be defined by responses of “agree” or “strongly agree” on this item on the rotation survey.
- **Participation** The cumulative (by fiscal year) proportion of CPWE leadership calls with the CPWE Lead in attendance. If the CPWE Lead will have an extensive absence, an alternative Lead can be proactively identified to the Medical Director.
- **Increased Access for Children and Youth** The quarterly proportion of encounters provided by CPWE-affiliated providers that are provided to children or youth, ages 0 to 20, or perinatal adults.

Note: Benchmarks will be specific to each HRI local context and performance in FY2026.

CAP Fellowship: Proposed Performance Metrics

- Participation Percent of CAP Fellowship leadership calls with HRI Lead in full attendance. If the HRI Lead will have an extensive absence, an alternative Lead can be proactively identified to CAP Fellowship Medical Director.
